There were AACA members in for the weekend from all parts of the country and with a diverse mix of interests within the hobby. The seminar subjects emphasize the diversity: Documented Race Cars, Tops and Upholstery, The Amphicar, Recruiting Young Adult Members, History of License Plates, Mopeds and Powered Cycles, Residential Automotive Lifts, Early Buicks, and Publications – are a sampling of more than 40 seminars offered.

Seminars were offered both Friday and Saturday. The Trade Show also ran both days on the ballroom level where the registration, morning refreshments, and box lunches were available.

Saturday morning started with judging schools: National Judging for members with fewer than 16 credits, Advanced Judging for members and team captains with more than 15 credits, and chief judges and registration. In the National Judging school there were more than 250 in attendance. At 2 PM the General Membership Meeting was held. We heard a summary from all the national officers about their area of responsibility. And we learned about the direction that the national club will be taking over the next year.

It placed third in the race, with the other two E.M.F.s placing first and second. In recent years #33 has competed in many vintage car races.

Saturday evening there was a reception before the Annual Awards Banquet, which gave everyone a chance to mingle and catch up with the past two days.
