placed in hobby magazines, *Antique Automobile*, hobby websites, the Club’s website, through distribution of the *Bulletin*, and from placement of flyers. We are drawing big crowds, so our promotional activities seem to be working.



Our call for volunteers to help with Friday’s setup, Saturday’s vendor placement and shopper parking, and cleanup Saturday afternoon resulted in a good turnout of members. Also, the request for additional food donations was quite successful. We had an excellent selection of homemade items and soups. Sales of the 50/50 drawing tickets went well too.

Since the Flea Market is the Club’s primary revenue source, it was good to see so much support this year from our members, old and new. Everyone seemed to be having a good time helping their Club. It was a real team effort!

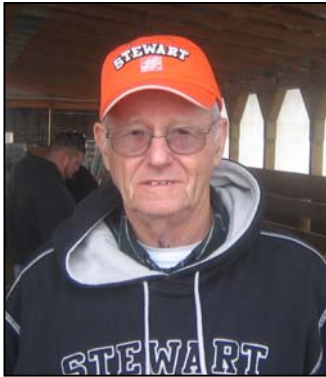
