

Test Your Automotive History Knowledge - Part Two



Last year, Club members participated in an automotive history quiz during the AACA Museum Spring Tour. It was repeated in the *Bulletin*. The quiz tested members' knowledge about advancements during the early years of Ford, GM, and Chrysler; plus their memory about the last wave of automakers that stopped production after WWII, which created many of today's orphan cars.

It's a simple format – twelve car photos are provided on this page. All you have to do is name the make and year of each car. The quiz answers appear at the bottom of the page, but play fair and identify the cars before you look at the correct answers.

This second edition automotive history quiz has a different challenge. It tests your visual memory about American cars of all eras from the 1980s back to the early years.

Each photo is worth 30 points – 20 for the car and 10 for the year. A score of 250 or more puts you in the category of knowledgeable about automotive history. A lesser score means that you need to get to the AACA Museum and Library to bone-up on the history of the automobile.



ANSWERS: If you haven't figured out this quiz you don't get to many Club events. All of the cars pictured belong to members and have been at events in the past four years. From the top row left to right: 1930 Ford Model A, 1904 Oldsmobile, 1910 Ford Model T, 1980 Plymouth, 1960 Edsel, 1965 Buick, 1932 Chrysler, 1940 Ford, 1977 Cadillac, 1953 Pontiac, 1952 DeSoto, and 1963 Ford Falcon.
