Barrett-Jackson Auction Co., Ramps Up For What May Be The Most Significant Collector Car Auction To Date

Beginning on January 13, 2015, in Scottsdale, AZ, for six consecutive days, Barrett-Jackson will send some of the most iconic, sought after and expensive vehicles and 'automobilia' across the auction block. The 'Pratte' Museum collection will be auctioned in its entirety, all at 'no reserve.' No reserve means whatever the highest bid is on any item, it will sell for the hammer price, plus taxes and fees which can add 8-10% to the sale price.

The collection is owned by Ron Pratte, a media shy, self-made,

mega-millionaire in the construction business. Over the last decade or so, Mr. Pratte acquired many manufacturer's 'one-off's', such as the 1954 Pontiac Bonneville Special, a two-place roadster similar to early Chevrolet Corvettes. Also, from General Motors, a 1953 Buick Roadmaster sedan that was the last car that billionaire recluse, Howard Hughes drove personally. Because of his fear of 'germs' Hughes had the Buick modified with four, six volt batteries in the trunk along with a 'bacteria box.' The vehicle's air-conditioning would operate even with the motor off. All the windows in the car except the driver's window were rendered 'inoperative' to keep out bacteria. The Roadmaster was in storage along with Mr. Hughes giant, eight-motored, wooden 'Spruce Goose' aircraft in Long Beach, California for decades. Last we heard, the Buick had less than 10k miles on the odometer.

Other vehicles in the collection are a number of Ford and Shelby Mustangs and a vehicle that belonged to his friend and fellow entrepreneur, Carroll Shelby. Shelby's electric blue, AC Cobra 'supersnake' with a 427 c.i. Ford motor with TWO superchargers.

Pratte was also a fan of the legendary automobile designer, the late Boyd Coddington. One of Coddington's cars in the auction is the 'Chezoom', a highly stylized two-door with 1957 Chevrolet Bel Air characteristics. Pratte purchased many of these vehicles at previous Barrett-Jackson auctions and paid millions of dollars, often what amounted to record-breaking prices at the time.

Cars and trucks are not the only items being auctioned, lots of 'automobilia' in the form of gas pumps, gas globes, electric neon and porcelain signs of car brands, oil companies and other automotive related products. There will even be 66 children's pedal cars which are regarded as the best of the best in the world.
